Dear Parents / Fellow Members

Hopefully most on you should know me by now, if not by name then certainly by sight. This will be the first annual review I have had to present, and not being part of the group over the previous year means that it is difficult to tell you what the group we been up to so I will concentrate on the where we are today and the future.

Since the parents evening in June we have come a long way. Then there was talk of the group not being able to continue and potentially closing. A lot of work has been completed since then. We now have new section leaders, Clare Mann took over as Beaver leader together with Dave Mark who is looking after Scouts. On the executive committee side Jean Dejean formally takes over as Treasure for the group at the review meeting, and Mark Woodruff is now after all the group's equipment as Quartermaster.

The group's membership has increased significantly since the census was last completed in January and in June where we were down to approximately 18 members.

Beaver's has seen the most increase which is important for the group as it feeds the other sections and gets kids involved in Scouting at an early age. Attached is a copy of the groups audited accounts. Please take the time to look through, you will note over the last two years the group has lost money and it's reserves are at an all time low. One of our challenges over the next 12 months is to get more funds in to the group. Currently your subscription money (subs)



covers expenses such as membership to the Scouting Association, rent, insurances etc. However we need to purchase equipment for the group to run activities such as camping. I would ask that you support fund raising activities and that if you have ideas that could help bring more funds in to the group speak to either your section leader, Jean or myself.

To move the group forward we need the continued support of all the parents in many areas. Parent rota's are now running across all the sections and offers tremendous help to all the leaders. Thank you to all those parents who have helped out so far, and for those. I know I sound like a worn out record but we need more ! Critically the group must find a Cub Leader by the end of December. Liz Arkless has done a great job in looking after the section but has other duties in district which she must return to in the New Year. Additionally we need assistant leaders for all the sections and executive committee members. If you can help in any way then either speak to your section leader of myself.

Finally, I am sure everyone would like to say a big thank you to Gary and his team of district leaders – Yvonne (Beavers), Liz (Cubs), Mick, Graham & Liz (Scouts), who have put so much hard work in to keeping group going during the year. We greatly appreciate all their efforts and thank them for their continued support over the coming months and years.
