#### **Group Scout Leader's Review**

Dear Parents / Fellow Members

It's that time of year again where we review what the group has being doing over the past 12 months and look forward to the next.

2004/2005 has been particularly challenging, following the last AGM the group was short of funds, members and more importantly leaders. I am pleased to say that we have made significant progress in most of these areas.

The group is now lucky enough to have two leaders in each section with the recent addition of Tricia and Robert King as Cub leaders. We now have an active committee which is taking care of day to day administration and fund raising. All of these factors are helping to ensure we can focus more on section meetings and running more outside activities

The group's membership has increased significantly since 2004. At the census (completed in January) the group membership stood at 43 and at the 1st June there were approximately 50 members.

It is good to hear that many new members are joining because they have heard from other members that Scouting is fun and that they have a great time. This is credit to the leaders who give up their free time, unpaid, to prepare and run the meeting.

Attached is a copy of the group's audited accounts. Please take the time to look through, you will note over the last two years the group has lost money and its reserves are at an all time low. This is due to a number of factors not least because our membership increased significantly just before we needed to pay capitation (membership) fees to the Scouting Association for each member and Leader. One of our challenges last year was to reduce expenditure and fund raise. I would like to thank Marks & Spencer's, and in particular Caroline Mark, for allowing us to run two bag packing activities over the last 6 months that managed to raise nearly £900 for the group.

However we need to do more if the Group is to increase its cash reserves and continue providing equipment/activities. For the first time in 18 months the Group is increasing it's subscriptions,



from September, to £35 per term. However, to encourage extra support with section meetings and fundraising there will be £3 discount for parents / carers that place their name on the Parent Helpers Rota. See your section leader for more details. Additionally if you have any fund raising ideas let us know!

Finally, I am sure you will join with me in saying a big thank you to the section leaders, Dave (SL), Mick (ASL), Tricia (CL), Robert (ACL), Clare (BL) and Stuart (ABL) as well as Lynn who helps out at Beavers every week, who have worked very hard over the last year to run their sections. Additionally my thanks to the committee, especially Julie and Jean who keep me in check, Mark for hosting all the group's equipment and Richard for taking on the role of Chairman.

We greatly appreciate all their efforts and thank them for their continued support over the coming months and years.

The display they put on included a traditional Polish meal cooked by one of the Scouts, a PowerPoint presentation on Famous people and a short talk on the Culture and Lifestyle this was well received by the rest of the District.

On the Camping front, other than the Competition Camp we have held a 2 night camp at Henlow back in November, this was sleeping in a building and included the Armistice Parade that we were allowed to join, also, we have recently carried out a long weekend camp at Phasels Wood nr Hemel We took 14 Scouts with us and this was the first time under canvas for a lot of the them. On the camp some of the things they learned were Cooking on open fires, how to use Axes & Saws, Site cleanliness and Camp Hygiene. They also had the chance to try Abseiling and Pot Holing in man made tunnels. They even managed to put up their own tents.

Over the next few months we are planning another camp during the Summer Holidays, also more badges will be earned and we are looking at starting a Conservation Project which should give the Scouts a chance to work with the other Sections.

## 1st Crownhill Scout Group

#### Treasure's review

Attached is a copy of the group's audit accounts for the year 2004/2005. First impressions on paper are not good, with the group having just £774.60 net in the bank and cash at the end of March – which is down on the same period last year.

However, there are several reasons for this:

- 1. The accounts cover the period 1 April 04 31 March 05. During the transition period for the group during the summer term last year, events were being organized for the members but no subs were being collected. This had a major impact on receipts for that period.
- 2. The new leaders and committee did not join until September 04, by which time the member numbers were quite low. Through the hard work of the leaders, membership increased dramatically but this had the 'knock on' effect of much larger numbers when the year end census was completed. This meant that the group had a massive capitation bill of £1632 to find in March 05 and increase of £642 on the same period last year. The Group also managed to subsidise the annual Christmas Party, despite funds being low.

Despite this, overall, spending has remained under control for the group and with several fundraising events (including the massively successful bag packing events at M&S) having taken place recently funds have increased considerably. Our major income still remains subs and we need to continue to be more efficient and timely when collecting subs to ensure our cashflow remains consistent and parents are paying for their child attending the sessions.

The new financial year looks more promising. As at 31 May 05, the Reserve A/c had a balance of £261.50, the Main A/c £1582.43 (including paid out but not yet cleared), so the overall net funds were £1843.93.
